Executive Summary

January 2007 – March 2007

In the third quarter of FY 2007 the number of juvenile offenders in state custody decreased from 760 in the previous quarter to 755. This is attributed to the number of juveniles in Intensive Casework Management (ICM) decreasing.

Basic demographic characteristics remain unchanged. The population of youth committed to custody is predominately male (77%). Under half (40%) were committed on misdemeanor offenses. Over half (57%) are sixteen years of age or older.


In the third quarter, thirty-seven (37) incidents of suspected abuse or neglect were reported to the DYS internal affairs unit. Of the thirty-seven (37) incidents, the Arkansas State Police determined twenty-one (21) merited an investigation. Of the twenty-one (21), two (2) were founded, four (4) were unfounded, and fifteen (15) remain under investigation. If the incident reported by a youth in DYS custody for alleged abuse occurred prior to placement with DYS, DYS is not privy to the outcome of those investigations.


Chart 1: Commitments

Chart 3: Commitments by Age





Chart 4: Commitments by Gender

Chart 5: Commitments by Race





Chart 6: Commitments by Offense

Chart 7: Commitments by Person Crimes





Chart 8: Violent* Vs. Non-Violent Offense Commitments

Chart 9: Releases





Chart 10: Total Population in Custody*



Chart 11: Population by Program Type*



Chart 13: Community Based Services Dollars by Program Designation





Chart 14: Purchase of Service Placements

* Since the Hotline and the Investigations unit are two separate sections within the Arkansas State Police, the Hotline may accept an incident called in, then later the incident will not be investigated by the Investigations Unit after review of the circumstances. The DYS IAU never receives a follow-up on these reports to know whether they were ever investigated. Some of these incidents occurred prior to the juvenile being committed to DYS. The IAU does not receive notification of the findings in these incidents. Some incidents that are reported in one quarter may not be finalized by the State Police until sometime within the next quarter.

Category of Incidents Accepted by Child Abuse Hotline



