## **SECTION 1 - GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION**

## 1.1 PURPOSE

This Invitation for Bid (IFB) is issued by the Office of Procurement (OP) for the Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS), Division of Children and Family Services(DCFS) to obtain qualified vendors to provide Counseling Services for DCFS clients to prevent out-of-home placement of children and to promote reunification of families. These services are designed to be a brief intervention model that encourages families to build upon their existing strengths, to develop capacities to meet their needs and to acquire new skills. Counseling will be directed toward improving the client's ability to function effectively within the family.

## 1.2 INTERGOVERNMENTAL/COOPERATIVE USE OF PROPOSAL AND CONTRACT

In accordance with Arkansas Code §19-11-249, this proposal and resulting contract is available to any State Agency or Institution of Higher Education that wishes to utilize the services of the selected proposer, and the proposer agrees, they may enter into an agreement as provided in this solicitation.

#### 1.3 TYPE OF CONTRACT

- A. A Term contract will be awarded to multiple vendors.
- B. Any resultant contract of this *Bid Solicitation* **shall** be subject to State approval processes which may include Legislative review.
- C. The term of this contract **shall** be for one (1) year. The anticipated starting date for the contract is July 1, 2024. Upon agreement by the vendor and agency the contract may be renewed by the Office of Procurement (OP) on a year-to-year basis, for up to six (6) additional one-year terms or a portion thereof not to exceed a total aggregate contract term of seven (7) years.

#### 1.4 ISSUING AGENCY

The OP, as the issuing office, is the sole point of contact throughout this solicitation process. Vendor questions regarding this Bid Solicitation should be made through the State's buyer as shown on page two of this document. Vendor's questions will be answered as a courtesy and at vendor's own risk.

## 1.5 BID OPENING LOCATION

Bids submitted by the opening date and time will be opened via video conference. DHS will publish a link to the live bid opening on the DHS website for public access. Individuals will not be permitted to attend in-person. If the bid opening cannot be held as scheduled due to technical or other issues, DHS will publish an updated schedule and video conference link on the DHS website.

#### 1.6 DEFINITION OF REQUIREMENT

- A. The words "must" and "shall" signify a Requirement of this solicitation and that vendor's agreement to and compliance with that item is mandatory.
- B. Exceptions taken to any Requirement in this *Bid Solicitation*, whether submitted in the vendor's bid or in subsequent correspondence, **shall** cause the vendor's bid to be disqualified.

## 1.7 DEFINITION OF TERMS

- A. The State Procurement Official has made every effort to use industry-accepted terminology in this *Bid Solicitation* and will attempt to further clarify any point of an item in question as indicated in *Clarification of Bid Solicitation*.
- B. The words "bidder," "vendor," and "contractor" are used synonymously in this document.
- C. The terms "Invitation for Bid", "IFB" and "Bid Solicitation" are used synonymously in this document.

## 1.8 RESPONSE DOCUMENTS

- A. Bid Response Packet
  - 1. An official authorized to bind the vendor(s) to a resultant contract **must** sign the *Bid Signature Page*.

2. Vendor's signature on this page **shall** signify vendor's agreement that either of the following **shall** cause the vendor's bid to be disqualified:

- a. Additional terms or conditions submitted intentionally or inadvertently.
- b. Any exception that conflicts with a Requirement of this Bid Solicitation.
- 3. The following items **shall** be submitted with the *Bid Response Packet in a sealed envelope*:
  - a. EO 98-04 Contract and Grant Disclosure Form (Attachment A).
  - b. Copy of Vendor's Equal Opportunity Policy. (See Equal Opportunity Policy.)
  - c. Certification for Boycott and Illegal Immigrant Restrictions (Attachment H)
  - d. Signed addenda to this IFB, if applicable. (See Requirement of Addendum.)
  - e. Documentation that vendor meets the minimum qualifications outlined in this IFB. (See *Minimum Qualifications*.)
- 4. **DO NOT** include any other documents or ancillary information, such as a cover letter or promotional/marketing information. **Submit one (1) electronic copy of the response packet, excluding the** *Official Bid Price Sheet*, preferably on a flash drive and one (1) hard copy. To the extent possible, all electronic files should be a single document in PDF format.
- B. Official Bid Price Sheet. (See Pricing.)
  - 5. Vendor's original Official Bid Price Sheet must be submitted in hard copy format.
  - 6. Vendor should also submit one (1) electronic copy of the *Official Bid Price Sheet*, preferably on a flash drive, in a single PDF file.
  - 7. The Official Bid Price Sheet, including the hard copy and electronic copy, must be separately sealed from the Bid Response Packet and should be clearly marked as "Pricing." Vendor must not include any pricing in the hard copies or electronic copies of the Bid Response Packet.

#### 1.9 AGREEMENT AND COMPLIANCE PAGE

- A. Vendor **must** sign the *Agreement and Compliance Page* relevant to each section of the *Bid Solicitation Document*. The *Agreement and Compliance Page* is included in the Bid *Response Packet*.
- B. Vendor's signature on these pages **shall** signify agreement to and compliance with all requirements within the designated section.

## 1.10 CLARIFICATION OF BID SOLICITATION

- A Contractor may submit written questions requesting clarification of information contained in this *Bid Solicitation*. Written questions should be submitted by 4:00 p.m., Central Time on November 15, 2023. Submit written questions by email to the buyer as shown on page one (1) of this *Bid Solicitation*.
- B. The attached response template (*Attachment B*) **must** be used for submission of all written questions. All questions should include the information specified in the response template. Written questions submitted in a different format may not be answered by DHS.
- C. Contractor's written questions will be consolidated and responded to by the State. The State's consolidated written response is anticipated to be posted to the OP website by the close of business on November 29, 2023.
- D. Answers to verbal questions may be given as a matter of courtesy and **must** be evaluated at contractor's risk.

## 1.11 SUBCONTRACTORS

- A. Vendor **must** complete and submit the *Proposed Subcontractors Form* included in the *Bid Response Packet* to indicate vendor's intent to utilize, or to not utilize, subcontractors.
- B. Additional subcontractor information may be required or requested in following sections of this *Bid Solicitation*. **Do not** attach any additional information to the *Proposed Subcontractors Form*.
- C. The utilization of any proposed subcontractor is subject to approval by the State agency.

#### 1.12 PRICING

A. Vendor(s) **must** include all pricing on the Official Bid Price Sheet(s) only. Any cost not identified by the successful vendor but subsequently incurred in order to achieve successful operation **shall** be borne by the vendor. The *Official Bid Price Sheet* is provided in the Bid Response Packet.

- B. A justification of prices quoted should be attached to the Official Bid Price Sheet.
- C. To allow time to evaluate bids, prices **must** be valid for one hundred twenty (120) days following the bid opening.
- D. Failure to complete and submit the Official Bid Price Sheet shall result in disqualification.
- E. All bid pricing **must** be in United States dollars and cents.
- F. The Official Bid Price Sheet may be reproduced as needed.

#### 1.13 PRIME CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY

- A. A joint bid submitted by two (2) or more vendors is acceptable. However, a single vendor **must** be identified as the prime contractor.
- B. The prime contractor **shall** be held responsible for the contract and **shall** be the sole point of contact.

## 1.14 INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION

- A. By submission of this bid, the vendor certifies, and in the case of a joint response, each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, that in connection with this bid:
  - 1. The prices in the bid have been arrived at independently, without collusion.
  - 2. No prior information concerning these prices has been received from, or given to, a competitive company.
- B. Evidence of collusion **shall** warrant consideration of this bid by the Office of the Attorney General. All vendors **shall** understand that this paragraph may be used as a basis for litigation.

## 1.15 PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

- A. Submission documents pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* become the property of the State and are subject to the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- B. In accordance with FOIA and to promote maximum competition in the State competitive bidding process, the State may maintain the confidentiality of certain types of information described in FOIA. Such information may include trade secrets defined by FOIA and other information exempted from the Public Records Act pursuant to FOIA.
- C. Prospective Contractor may designate appropriate portions of its response as confidential, consistent with and to the extent permitted under the Statutes and Rules set forth above, by submitting a redacted copy of the response.
- D. By redacting any information contained in the response, the Prospective Contractor warrants that it has formed a good faith opinion having received such necessary or proper review by counsel and other knowledgeable advisors that the portions redacted meet the requirements of the Rules and Statutes set forth above.
- E. Under no circumstances will pricing information be designated as confidential.
- F. One (1) complete copy of the submission documents from which any proprietary information has been redacted should be submitted on a flash drive in the *Bid Response Packet*. A CD is also acceptable. Do not submit documents via email or fax.
- G. Except for the redacted information, the redacted copy **must** be identical to the original hard copy, reflecting the same pagination as the original and showing the space from which information was redacted.

H. The Prospective Contractor is responsible for identifying all proprietary information and for ensuring the electronic copy is protected against restoration of redacted data.

- The redacted copy will be open to public inspection under FOIA without further notice to the Prospective Contractor.
- J. If a redacted copy of the submission documents is not provided with Prospective Contractor's Bid Response Packet, a copy of the non-redacted documents, with the exception of financial data (other than pricing), will be released in response to any request made under FOIA.
- K. If the State deems redacted information to be subject to FOIA, the Prospective Contractor will be contacted prior to release of the documents.
- L. The State has no liability to a Prospective Contractor with respect to the disclosure of Prospective Contractor's confidential information ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction pursuant to FOIA or other applicable law.

#### 1.16 CAUTION TO VENDORS

- A. Prior to any contract award, all communication concerning this Bid Solicitation must be addressed through OP.
- B. Vendor must not alter any language in any solicitation document provided by the State.
- C. Vendor **must not** alter the Official Bid Price Sheet.
- D. All official documents and correspondence related to this solicitation **shall** be included as part of the resultant contract.
- E. Bids **must** be submitted in the English language.
- F. The State **shall** have the right to award or not award a contract, if it is in the best interest of the State to do so.
- G. Vendor must provide clarification of any information in their response documents as requested by OP.
- H. Bids must meet or exceed all defined specifications as set forth in this Bid Solicitation.
- I. Bids **must** meet all terms and conditions of this Invitation for Bid and the laws of the State of Arkansas.
- J. Vendors may submit multiple bids.

#### 1.17 REQUIREMENT OF ADDENDUM

- A. This Bid Solicitation shall be modified only by an addendum written and authorized by OP.
- B. An addendum posted within three (3) calendar days prior to the bid opening **shall** extend the bid opening and may or may not include changes to the Bid Solicitation.

## 1.18 AWARD PROCESS

- A. Vendor Selection
  - Award will be made to lowest responsible, responsive bidder based on lowest rate per counseling service. Bidders must meet minimum qualifications. Bids must meet or exceed all defined specifications. Bids must meet all terms and conditions of this Invitation for Bid and the laws of the State of Arkansas.

 Awarded Contractors will be listed by the lowest priced Contractor for each type of counseling service. The lowest priced Contractor for each counseling service type shall be listed as the first contact. DHS may contact Contractors in ascending order from lowest price to highest price based on service type, proximity, and availability to the client.

- 3. DCFS intends to receive services with the least overall expense to the State. If multiple Contractors of equal distance from the client's current location can provide counseling services for that client, DCFS will select the Contractor with the lowest rate. However, in such a circumstance, where the cost of travel may increase the State's total expense, DCFS may choose to select the Contractor with the lessor expense to the State.
- 4. Contract award, extension, or renewal is contingent upon approval by DHS officials, subsequent approval by the OP, review by the Legislative Council and the availability of State funds. Changes to any non-financial portion of this agreement may be made with the agreement of both DHS and the Contractor.
- 5. If Option B is selected to bid Medicaid rates, rates will be compared to the most recently published Medicaid rates.

#### B. Negotiations

- 1. If the State so chooses, negotiations may be conducted with the lowest responsive bidder. Negotiations are conducted at the sole discretion of the State.
- 2. If negotiations fail to result in a contract, the State may begin the negotiation process with the next lowest responsive bidder. The negotiation process may be repeated until the lowest responsive vendor has been determined, or until such time the State decides not to move forward with an award.

## C. Anticipation to Award

- 1. Once an anticipated successful vendor has been determined, the anticipated award will be posted on the following websites:

- 2. The anticipated award will be posted for a period of fourteen (14) days prior to the issuance of a contract. Vendors and agencies are cautioned that these are preliminary results only, and a contract will not be issued prior to the end of the fourteen (14) day posting period.
- 3. OP **shall** have the right to waive the policy of Anticipation to Award when it is in the best interest of the State.
- 4. It is the vendor's responsibility to check the above referenced websites for the posting of an anticipated award.

## D. Issuance of Contract

- 1. Any resultant contract of this Bid Solicitation shall be subject to State approval processes which may include Legislative review.
- 2. An Office of Procurement Official will be responsible for award and administration of any resulting contract.

## 1.19 MINORITY AND WOMEN-OWNED BUSINESS POLICY

- A. A minority-owned business is defined by Arkansas Code Annotated § 15-4-303 as a business that is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned by a lawful permanent resident of this State who is:
  - African American
  - American Indian
  - Asian American
  - Hispanic American
- Pacific Islander American
- A Service-disabled Veteran as designated by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs

B. A woman-owned business is defined by Arkansas Code Annotated § 15-4-303(9) as a business that is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned by one (1) or more women who are lawful permanent residents of this State.

C. The Arkansas Economic Development Commission conducts a certification process for minority-owned and women-owned businesses. If certified, the Prospective Contractor's Certification Number should be included on the *Bid Signature Page*.

## 1.20 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY POLICY

- A. In compliance with Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-104, the State is required to have a copy of the anticipated Contractor's *Equal Opportunity (EO) Policy* prior to issuing a contract award.
- B. EO Policies should be included as a hardcopy accompanying the solicitation response.
- C. The submission of an *EO Policy* to the OP is a one-time requirement. Vendors are responsible for providing updates or changes to their respective policies, and for supplying *EO Policies* upon request to other State agencies that must also comply with this statute.
- D. Vendors, who are not required by law by to have an *EO Policy*, **must** submit a written statement to that effect.

#### 1.21 PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS

- A. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-105, prior to the award of a contract, selected vendor(s) **must** have a current certification on file with the OP stating that they do not employ or contract with illegal immigrants.
- B. OP will notify the selected vendor(s) prior to award if their certification has expired or is not on file. Instructions for completing the certification process will be provided to the vendor(s) at that time.

## 1.22 RESTRICTION OF BOYCOTT OF ISRAEL

- A. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 25-1-503, a public entity **shall not** enter into a contract with a company unless the contract includes a written certification that the person or company is not currently engaged in and agrees for the duration of the contract not to engage in, a boycott of Israel.
- B. This prohibition does not apply to a company which offers to provide the goods or services for at least twenty percent (20%) less than the lowest certifying business.
- C. By checking the designated box on the Bid Signature Page of the response packet, a Prospective Contractor agrees and certifies that they do not, and will not for the duration of the contract, boycott Israel.

## 1.23 PAST PERFORMANCE

In accordance with provisions of State Procurement Law, specifically OSP Rule R5:19-11-230(b)(1), a vendor's past performance with the State may be used to determine if the vendor is "responsible." Proposals submitted by vendors determined to be non-responsible **shall** be disqualified.

## 1.24 TECHNOLOGY ACCESS

- A. When procuring a technology product or when soliciting the development of such a product, the State of Arkansas is required to comply with the provisions of Arkansas Code Annotated § 25-26-201 et seq., which expresses the policy of the State to provide individuals who are blind or visually impaired with access to information technology purchased in whole or in part with state funds. The Prospective Contractor expressly acknowledges and agrees that state funds may not be expended in connection with the purchase of information technology unless that technology meets the statutory requirements found in 36 C.F.R. § 1194.21, as it existed on January 1, 2019 (software applications and operating ICSs) and 36 C.F.R. § 1194.22, as it existed on January 1, 2019 (web-based intranet and internet information and applications), in accordance with the State of Arkansas technology policy standards relating to accessibility by persons with visual impairments.
- B. Accordingly, the Prospective Contractor expressly represents and warrants to the State of Arkansas through the procurement process by submission of a Voluntary Product Accessibility Template (VPAT) for 36 C.F.R. § 1194.21, as it existed on January 1, 2019 (software applications and operating ICSs) and 36 C.F.R. § 1194.22,

that the technology provided to the State for purchase is capable, either by virtue of features included within the technology, or because it is readily adaptable by use with other technology, of:

- 1. Providing, to the extent required by Arkansas Code Annotated § 25-26-201 et seq., equivalent access for effective use by both visual and non-visual means.
- 2. Presenting information, including prompts used for interactive communications, in formats intended for non-visual use.
- 3. After being made accessible, integrating into networks for obtaining, retrieving, and disseminating information used by individuals who are not blind or visually impaired.
- 4. Providing effective, interactive control and use of the technology, including without limitation the operating system, software applications, and format of the data presented is readily achievable by nonvisual means.
- 5. Being compatible with information technology used by other individuals with whom the blind or visually impaired individuals interact.
- 6. Integrating into networks used to share communications among employees, program participants, and the public.
- 7. Providing the capability of equivalent access by nonvisual means to telecommunications or other interconnected network services used by persons who are not blind or visually impaired.
- C. State agencies cannot claim a product as a whole is not reasonably available because no product in the marketplace meets all the standards. Agencies must evaluate products to determine which product best meets the standards. If an agency purchases a product that does not best meet the standards, the agency must provide written documentation supporting the selection of a different product, including any required reasonable accommodations.
- D. For purposes of this section, the phrase "equivalent access" means a substantially similar ability to communicate with, or make use of, the technology, either directly, by features incorporated within the technology, or by other reasonable means such as assistive devices or services which would constitute reasonable accommodations under the Americans with Disabilities Act or similar state and federal laws. Examples of methods by which equivalent access may be provided include, but are not limited to, keyboard alternatives to mouse commands or other means of navigating graphical displays, and customizable display appearance. As provided in Arkansas Code Annotated § 25-26-201 et seq., if equivalent access is not reasonably available, then individuals who are blind or visually impaired **shall** be provided a reasonable accommodation as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 12111(9), as it existed on January 1, 2013.
- E. If the information manipulated or presented by the product is inherently visual in nature, so that its meaning cannot be conveyed non-visually, these specifications do not prohibit the purchase or use of an information technology product that does not meet these standards.

## 1.25 COMPLIANCE WITH THE STATE SHARED TECHNICAL ARCHITECTURE PROGRAM

The respondent's solution must comply with the state's shared Technical Architecture Program which is a set of policies and standards that can be viewed at <a href="https://www.dfa.arkansas.gov/intergovernmental-services/state-technology-cost-analysis/architecture-compliance/">https://www.dfa.arkansas.gov/intergovernmental-services/state-technology-cost-analysis/architecture-compliance/</a>. Only those standards which are fully promulgated or have been approved by the Governor's Office apply to this solution.

#### 1.26 MASTERCARD ACCEPTANCE

- A. Awarded vendor should have the capability of accepting the State's authorized MASTERCARD Procurement Card (p-card) as a method of payment.
- B. Price changes or additional fee(s) shall not be levied against the State when accepting the p-card as a form of payment.
- C. MASTERCARD is not the exclusive method of payment.

## 1.27 PUBLICITY

A. Vendors **shall not** issue a news release pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* or any portion of the project without OP's prior written approval.

B. Failure to comply with this Requirement **shall** be cause for a vendor's bid to be disqualified.

#### 1.28 RESERVATION

The State **shall not** pay costs incurred in the preparation of a bid.

## **SECTION 2 - MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS**

#### 2.1 INTRODUCTION

This Invitation for Bid (IFB) is issued by the Office of Procurement (OP) for the Arkansas Department of Human Services (DHS), Division of Children and Family Services (DCFS) seeking pricing and contracts for counseling services to DCFS clients, both children and adults.

#### 2.2 MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

The Contractor **must** meet the following requirements:

- A. The Contractor **must** be registered to do business in the State of Arkansas and in good standing by the initial start of any resulting contract. For verification purposes, Contractor **must** provide a <u>Certificate of Good Standing</u>, <u>Certificate of Authority</u>, other required <u>Arkansas Secretary of State</u> documentation such as non-filing or nonqualifying statements, upon DHS request.
- B. The bidder **must** include a copy of all required licensure and certification documents in the bidder's response to this solicitation. See "Response Documents."
- C. Counseling Services **shall** be provided by professionals licensed for independent practice in the state of Arkansas in the disciplines of Social Work, Counseling, or Psychology or by professionals meeting one (1) of the following:
  - a Licensed Master of Social Work (LMSW) supervised by a Licensed Certified Social Worker (LCSW).
  - a Licensed Associate Counselor (LAC) supervised by a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC).
  - · a Licensed Psychological Examiner (LPE) supervised by a Licensed Psychologist.

For verification purposes, Prospective Contractors **must** provide, with bid submission, copy of licensure or proof of supervision for each service provider.

D. Contractors **must** be Certified and enrolled as a Behavioral Health Agency (BHA), Community Support System Provider (CSSP), Independently Licensed Practitioner (ILP) or ILP Group provider in the Arkansas Medicaid Program. For verification purposes, Prospective Contractors **must** provide, with bid submission, copy of certification for each service provider.

## 2.3 SCOPE OF WORK

- A. Contractor **must** provide counseling services based on a family-centered approach and are intended to strengthen family functioning and are intended for families whose children are at risk of an out-of-home placement or have experienced an out-of-home placement and reunification is planned. Counseling **must** be directed toward improving the client's ability to function effectively within the family.
- B. Counseling Services are designed to be a brief intervention model that encourages families to build upon their existing strengths, to develop capacities to meet their needs, and to acquire new skills. Services may include but are not limited to problem identification and resolution; identification of feasible goals; emotional support and guidance; provision of basic skills for functioning in the community; exploration of possible alternative behavior patterns; and developing and strengthening the capacity for personal and social functioning improve parenting skills, anger management, conflict resolution, generational issues, domestic violence, substance abuse, and other issues. Contractors **shall** provide one (1) or more of the following counseling services:
  - Individual
  - Family
  - Group
  - Medication Management
- C. Services **shall** be provided designated to reach the following outcomes:
  - 1. Child Safety Outcome
    - a. Child Safety Outcome 1: Children are, first and foremost. Contractors **shall** keep children safe from abuse and neglect.
    - b. Child Safety Outcome 2: Children are safely maintained in their homes whenever possible and appropriate. The goal for child safety is to protect children from harm, prevent further abuse/neglect, and reduce the risks to their safety or well-being.

c. Contractors must ensure that counseling services address keeping children safe from abuse and neglect.

- d. Families receiving counseling services shall be provided appropriate services to keep children safe from abuse and neglect.
- e. The Contractor shall ensure that children are safely maintained in their homes whenever possible and appropriate.
  - Families receiving counseling intervention were provided appropriate interventions so that children remained safely in their homes during counseling intervention.
  - Families receiving counseling intervention were provided appropriate services and training to prevent their children from re-entering or entering foster care.

## 2. Permanency Outcome

- a. Permanency Outcome 1: Children have permanency and stability in their living situations.
- b. Permanency Outcome 2: The continuity of family relationships and connections is preserved for children. Family-centered services are intended to achieve safety for children by strengthening family and child functioning.
- c. The Contractor **shall** ensure that permanency and stability of the living situations is addressed through appropriate counseling interactions.
  - Families who have received counseling intervention will be provided with the services to successfully reunite with their families within the counseling intervention.
  - Families who have received counseling will receive appropriate services preventing the child from being removed from their home during the intervention.
  - The Contractor shall ensure that the continuity of family relationships and connections is preserved for children.
  - Families will be engaged in counseling services provided by the contractor that are geared toward preserving the family system.
  - Contractor **must** notify DCFS within twenty-four (24) hours if the family refuses to comply in order to develop a plan to promote engagement, if possible.

## 3. Child and Family Well-Being Outcome

- a. Child and Family Well-Being Outcome 1: Families have enhanced capacity to provide for their children's needs.
- b. Child and Family Well-Being Outcome 2: Children receive appropriate services to meet their educational, physical, and mental health needs.
- c. The Contractor must ensure that families have enhanced capacity to provide for their children.
  - Families receiving counseling intervention were provided appropriate services on how to advocate for existing community resources.
  - Families demonstrated ability to access services independently.
- 4. Contractor **shall** perform all other tasks necessary to provide services as set forth above.

#### D. Provider Qualifications

 The Contractor must remain certified and enrolled as a Behavioral Health Agency (BHA), Community Support System Provider (CSSP), Independently Licensed Practitioner (ILP) or ILP Group provider in the Arkansas Medicaid Program for the duration of the contract.

- 2. Required licensures and certification shall be maintained throughout the duration of the contract.
- 3. Verification of staff credentials **shall** be provided to DCFS upon request.
- 4. Contractor commits that it will not employ for services through this contract any person whose name appears on the registry as an offender of a true report of child maltreatment or who has an offense prohibited by Arkansas Code Annotated § 9-28-409 criminal records and child maltreatment checks.
- 5. The Contractor **shall** submit to the DCFS Counseling Program Manager the results of a check with the Arkansas Maltreatment Central Registry and a criminal background check for any current or prospective employee providing services through this contract. The Contractor **must** keep documentation of these results on file and available for audit by DHS.
- 6. Licensed professionals providing services **must** have a minimum of one (1) year experience in individual, family, and/or group therapy or under the supervision of a licensed professional. Provider **must** have experience providing counseling in home, community, natural environment, and office based.
- 7. Counseling services shall be provided by licensed professionals with expertise and experience in trauma-informed care. Each licensed mental health professional who provides DCFS counseling services can have training through Arkansas Building Effective Services for Trauma (ARBEST) for trauma informed therapies, certifications, or expertise in trauma-informed therapy/care.
- 8. Contractor **must** maintain a record of training, certification, or expertise in trauma-informed care for each licensed mental health professional providing services under this contract.
- 9. The provider **must** notify DCFS of any changes in personnel impacting the contracted services and provide documentation to DCFS of new personnel with their qualifications prior to the delivery of services.
- 10. The Contractor **shall** notify DCFS Program Manager of any changes in the business entity which include, but not limited to business entity existence, name change of the business, new location of the business, new telephone numbers and contact person.

#### E. Referrals

- 1. Clients will be referred to the Contractor by DCFS when deemed appropriate for an assessment for need for treatment services.
- 2. Contractors and DCFS Supervisor/designee **shall** collaborate to determine the appropriateness of referrals. The Contractor **must** inform the DCFS supervisor initially by email when there is a question concerning the appropriateness of the referral.
- 3. Contractors **must** accept all DCFS referrals allowable within the limitations of the contract budget. If the contractor does not have capacity to accept the client the Contractor **must** notify DCFS Supervisor, so DCFS can make other provisions for the client.
- 4. Referrals for services in adjacent counties to where the Contractor responded may be sent to the Contractor by DCFS. Contractors must accept referrals outside of their primary contracted area contingent on availability of staff and contract funding.
- 5. Primarily, parents require counseling to achieve reunification or to prevent out of home placement. Referrals for counseling may be requested by the family, caseworkers, or court ordered.

6. The Contractor shall keep a referral log that documents all referrals as well as the reason for any refused referrals.

#### F. Treatment Plan

- 1. Contractor **must** complete and submit an initial assessment and treatment plan to the DCFS Supervisor within ten (10) working days of the initial intake for services.
- 2. The Contractor **shall** submit to the county supervisor or designee a copy of the client's progress notes and any updates to the treatment plan. Justification shall remain in the client's file.
- 3. Contractor **shall** develop an assessment and treatment plan that addresses strength and needs of the client and family. The individual client/family treatment plan goals and objectives **must** be measurable and short term. The report will contain the following:
  - Plan for frequency of services number of hours of direct services planned.
  - Specified time frames for achievement of goals and Objectives.
- 4. Contractor must submit quarterly treatment plan updates to DCFS.

## G. Location and Scheduling

Counseling services may be provided in an office based, or natural environment and/or via telehealth when deemed appropriate for client. Counseling shall not interfere with client's daily work/ school schedule therefore scheduling for services **shall** be flexible.

## H. Service Requirements

- 1. The Contractor **must** provide services for each referral as specified in each client's treatment plan.
- Counseling services shall include individual, family, and/or group therapy. The service will build on the strengths of the family. The Contractor must understand environmental, behavioral, and cognitive interventions with families.
- 3. The Contractor **shall** ensure that services will continue, uninterrupted, if a therapist is unavailable for an extended period.
- 4. Contractor **shall** provide services for emotional support and guidance; problem identification and resolution; exploration of possible alternative behavior patterns; and the development and strengthening of capacity for personal and social functioning, improved parenting skills, anger management, conflict resolution, generational issues, domestic violence, substance abuse, and other issues.
- 5. When trauma is identified as a contributing factor to the current issues being addressed in treatment, the Contractor **must** utilize evidence-based practices or trauma informed best practices in counseling sessions. A trauma-informed service delivery approach **shall** be applied when applicable. Acceptable resources concerning trauma include, but are not limited to the following:

- 6. Contractor **must** provide individual, family, and /or group therapy in accordance with the client's treatment plan.
- 7. Contractor **shall** provide medication management as specified in the client's treatment plan (if available). If the Contractor is unable to provide medication management, the Contractor **shall** refer the client to a licensed psychiatrist or other medical professional authorized to provide medication management.

- 8. Contractor **must** maintain a service log documenting services rendered.
- 9. Contractor **shall** attend all meetings requested by DHS including but not limited to family team meetings, court hearings, wrap around staffing, trainings and must provide court room testimony upon request by DHS.

10. Contractor **must** submit client monthly progress notes to the DCFS Supervisor documenting services, including the client's response and engagement in services. These progress notes shall summarize dates/times of service, progress in counseling, and continued care recommendations. Progress notes are due by the 10th of each month.

## Monitoring

- 1. Contractor must notify the DCFS Supervisor by telephone and/or email within forty-eight (48) business hours when a family receiving counseling services misses a counseling session without advanced notification to the contractor. The contractor and DCFS staff will confer to determine if counseling will continue, if the safety of the children has been compromised, and what steps will be taken to ensure the future participation of the family in counseling. The DCFS Supervisor's approval to continue counseling will be required after each incidence of a missed counseling session without advanced notification to the contractor.
- 2. Contractor **must** notify the designated Program Manager when services are suspended for a minimum of three (3) consecutive business days due to illness, vacation, personal business, etc., The Program Manager will notify the area Financial Manager who will notify the County Supervisor. Planned absences should be reported two weeks in advance.
- The Contractor must complete and submit to the DCFS Supervisor within ten (10) working days of closure of services a final report on the family's progress, a discharge summary and continued after-care plan recommendations.

## J. Court

Contractor shall provide court testimony upon request from DCFS and the court.

## 2.4 BACKGROUND CHECK

The Vendor will perform criminal background checks on all proposed staff members. Pursuant to those background checks, no staff member **shall** be staffed on this project if they have committed an offense that would preclude State employment as a "designated position", if applicable to the underlying contracted services, under Ark. Code Ann. §21-15-102 or, otherwise as a "designated financial or information technology position" pursuant to Ark. Code Ann.§ 21- 15-111. Contractor shall not employ for services through this contract any person whose name appears on the registry as an offender of a true report of child maltreatment or who has an offense prohibited by Arkansas Code Annotated § 9-28-409 criminal records and child maltreatment checks.

Contractor shall submit to the DCFS Counseling Program Manager, the results of a check with the Arkansas Maltreatment Central Registry and a criminal background check for any current or prospective employee providing services through this contract. The contractor shall keep documentation of these results on file and available for audit by DHS.

#### 2.5 PRIVACY AND SECURITY

- A. The Contractor **shall** comply with all DHS policies governing the privacy and security of all personally identifiable information (PII) and/or other confidential information received or accessed on behalf of Arkansas DHS.
- B. The Contractor **shall** implement and maintain reasonable security procedures and practices regarding all protected health information and/or other confidential information as required by A.C.A § 4-110-104, The Personal Information Protection Act.
- C. The Contractor **shall** disclose any breaches of privacy or security by contacting the DHS Information Technology Security Office within one (1) business day of the breach at <a href="mailto:DHS.IT.Security.Team@dhs.arkansas.gov">DHS.IT.Security.Team@dhs.arkansas.gov</a>.

D. The Contractor **shall** use protected health information and/or other confidential information only in a manner that is necessary to provide the services required in this solicitation.

- E. The Contractor **shall** safeguard the use and disclosure of, and restrict access to, protected health information and/or other confidential information.
- F. The Contractor **must** maintain confidentiality and meet any applicable Privacy Act of 1974, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), and Health Information Technology for Economic and Clinical Health (HITECH) Act requirements. Prior to award, the Contractor **must** complete and sign a Business Associate Agreement (BAA).

## 2.6 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

- A. <u>State law requires that all contracts for services include Performance Standards for measuring the overall</u> quality of services provided. *Attachment C: Performance-Based Contracting* identifies expected deliverables, performance measures, or outcomes; and defines the acceptable standards a vendor **must** meet to avoid assessment of damages.
- B. The State may be open to negotiations of Performance Standards prior to contract award, prior to the commencement of services, or at times throughout the contract duration.
- C. The State **shall** have the right to modify, add, or delete Performance Standards throughout the term of the contract, should the State determine it is in its best interest to do so. Any changes or additions to performance standards will be made in good faith following acceptable industry standards and may include the input of the vendor so as to establish standards that are reasonably achievable.
- D. All changes made to the Performance Standards shall become an official part of the contract.
- E. Performance Standards shall continue throughout the term of the contract.
- F. Failure to meet the minimum Performance Standards as specified **may** result in the assessment of damages or termination of the contract.
- G. In the event a Performance Standard is not met, the vendor will have the opportunity to defend, respond to, or cure to as determined by the State, the insufficiency. The State may waive damages if it determines there were extenuating factors beyond the control of the vendor that hindered the performance of services or it is in the best interest of the State. In these instances, the State shall have final determination of the performance acceptability.
- H. Should any compensation be owed to the agency due to the assessment of damages, vendor **shall** follow the direction of the agency regarding the required compensation process.

## **SECTION 3 – GENERAL CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS**

• **Do not** provide responses to items in this section.

## 3.1 PAYMENT AND INVOICE PROVISIONS

- A. The Contractor **shall** obtain all referrals in advance before scheduling clients for service. Invoicing for services rendered without proper authorization is subject to denial by DCFS.
- B. Contractor shall bill Medicaid or insurance for clinical or covered services prior to billing contract.
- C. The Contractor **shall** bill the DCFS contract for clients that are not insured and are not Medicaid eligible.
- D. A minimum of seventy percent (70%) of all billed time (exclusive of travel time) for counseling services **must** be direct service. Direct service is defined as face-to-face contact with the family.
- E. The Contractor **shall** conduct activities and perform services resulting in the program deliverable from the beginning of the contract fiscal year through the end of the contract year and any contract extensions that may occur.
- F. Invoices for monthly billing must be developed online through the Provider Invoice Entry (PIE) application.
- G. Invoices along with the certification of compliance should be submitted to the DCFS Program Manager by the 10th day of the month. If the 10th day is on a weekend billing is due no later than the following Monday.
- H. The Contractor **shall** submit a monthly report which will include number of clients served, hours of service, services billed to Medicaid or other insurer, dollar amount billed to DCFS and contract balance.
- I. Billing must be signed electronically by an authorized agent or designee for the provider.
- J. Payment will be made in accordance with applicable State of Arkansas accounting procedures upon acceptance goods and services by the agency.
- K. The State shall not be invoiced in advance of delivery and acceptance of any goods or services.
- L. Payment will be made only after the vendor has successfully satisfied the agency as to the reliability and effectiveness of the goods or services purchased as a whole.
- M. The agency's Purchase Order Number and/or the Contract Number should be referenced on each invoice.
- N. Other sections of this Bid Solicitation may contain additional requirements for invoicing.
- O. Selected vendor must be registered to receive payment and future Bid Solicitation notifications. Vendors may register on-line at https://www.ark.org/vendor/index.html.

#### 3.2 GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. The State **shall not** lease any equipment or software for a period of time which continues past the end of a fiscal year unless the contract allows for cancellation by the State Procurement Official upon a 30-day written notice to the vendor/lessor in the event funds are not appropriated.
- B. The State **shall not** contract with another party to indemnify and defend that party for any liability and damages.
- C. The State **shall not** pay damages, legal expenses or other costs and expenses of any other party.
- D. The State **shall not** continue a contract once any equipment has been repossessed.

- E. Any litigation involving the State must take place in Pulaski County, Arkansas.
- F. The State **shall not** agree to any provision of a contract which violates the laws or constitution of the State of Arkansas.
- G. The State **shall not** enter a contract which grants to another party any remedies other than the following:
  - The right to possession.
  - 2. The right to accrued payments.
  - 3. The right to expenses of deinstallation.
  - 4. The right to expenses of repair to return the equipment to normal working order, normal wear and tear excluded.
  - 5. The right to recover only amounts due at the time of repossession and any unamortized nonrecurring cost as allowed by Arkansas Law.
- H. The laws of the State of Arkansas **shall** govern this contract.
- I. A contract **shall not** be effective prior to award being made by a State Procurement Official.
- J. In a contract with another party, the State will accept the risk of loss of the equipment or software and pay for any destruction, loss or damage of the equipment or software while the State has such risk, when:
  - 1. The extent of liability for such risk is based upon the purchase price of the equipment or software at the time of any loss.
  - 2. The contract has required the State to carry insurance for such risk.

## 3.3 CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- A. The vendor **shall** at all times observe and comply with federal and State of Arkansas laws, local laws, ordinances, orders, and regulations existing at the time of, or enacted subsequent to the execution of a resulting contract which in any manner affect the completion of the work.
- B. The vendor shall indemnify and save harmless the agency and all its officers, representatives, agents, and employees against any claim or liability arising from or based upon the violation of any such law, ordinance, regulation, order or decree by an employee, representative, or subcontractor of the vendor.
- C. The Contractor agrees to the Performance-Based Contracting standards as presented in Attachment C, DHS Standard Terms and Conditions as presented in Attachment D, a pro forma contract as presented in Attachment E, the Business Associate Agreement as presented in Attachment F, and the Organizational or Personal Conflict of Interest policy as presented in Attachment G.

## ALL VENDOR STAFF MAY BE MANDATED REPORTERS UNDER STATE AND FEDERAL MANDATES

## 3.4 STATEMENT OF LIABILITY

- A. The State will demonstrate reasonable care but will not be liable in the event of loss, destruction or theft of vendor-owned equipment or software and technical and business or operations literature to be delivered or to be used in the installation of deliverables and services. The vendor **shall** retain total liability for equipment, software and technical and business or operations literature. The State **shall** not at any time be responsible for or accept liability for any vendor-owned items.
- B. The vendor's liability for damages to the State **shall** be limited to the value of the Contract or five million dollars (\$5,000,000), whichever is higher. The foregoing limitation of liability **shall not** apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademarks or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the vendor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract. The vendor and the State **shall not** be liable to each other, regardless of the form of action, for consequential, incidental, indirect, or special damages. This limitation of liability **shall not** apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademark or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful

misconduct of the vendor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract.

C. Language in these terms and conditions **shall not** be construed or deemed as the State's waiver of its right of sovereign immunity. The vendor agrees that any claims against the State, whether sounding in tort or in contract, **shall** be brought before the Arkansas State Claims Commission as provided by Arkansas law, and **shall** be governed accordingly.

#### 3.5 PERFORMANCE BONDING

- A. The Contractor **shall** be required to obtain performance bonds to protect the State's interest as follows:
  - The amount of the performance bonds shall be one hundred percent (100%) of the annual contract price, unless the State determines that a lesser amount would be adequate for the protection of the State. Such performance bond must be provided to DHS prior to signing the contract.
  - The State shall require additional performance bond protection when a contract price is increased or modified.
  - 3. The additional performance bond **must** be delivered to the Arkansas Department of Human Services Chief Procurement Officer within fourteen (14) calendar days of request.
  - 4. The contractor **shall** notify the State of any changes, modification, or renewals for the performance bond during the term of the contract. The performance bond documentation **must** be provided to the State with each required notice.
  - 5. Failure to provide is a breach of contract and may result in immediate contract termination, prohibition against future bidding with the State, the addition of Contractor to the DHS excluded provider list, etc.

#### 3.6 RECORD RETENTION

- A. The vendor **shall** maintain all pertinent financial and accounting records and evidence pertaining to the contract in accordance with generally accepted principles of accounting and as specified by the State of Arkansas Law. Upon request, access **shall** be granted to State or Federal Government entities or any of their duly authorized representatives.
- B. Financial and accounting records **shall** be made available, upon request, to the State of Arkansas's designee(s) at any time during the contract period and any extension thereof, and for five (5) years from expiration date and final payment on the contract or extension thereof.
- C. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional requirements regarding record retention.

## 3.7 PRICE ESCALATION

- A. Price increases will be considered at the time of contract renewal.
- B. The vendor **must** provide to the Office of Procurement (OP) a written request for the price increase. The request **must** include supporting documentation demonstrating that the increase in contract price is based on an increase in market price. OP **shall** have the right to require additional information pertaining to the requested increase.
- C. Increases **shall not** be considered to increase profit or margins.
- D. OP **shall** have the right to approve or deny the request.

#### 3.8 CONFIDENTIALITY

A. The vendor, vendor's subsidiaries, and vendor's employees **shall** be bound to all laws and to all requirements set forth in this *Bid Solicitation* concerning the confidentiality and secure handling of information of which they may become aware of while providing services under a resulting contract.

B. Consistent and/or uncorrected breaches of confidentiality may constitute grounds for cancellation of a resulting contract, and the State **shall** have the right to cancel the contract on these grounds.

C. Previous sections of this Bid Solicitation may contain additional confidentiality requirements.

#### 3.9 CONTRACT INTERPRETATION

Should the State and vendor interpret specifications differently, either party may request clarification. However, if an agreement cannot be reached the determination of the State **shall** be final and controlling.

#### 3.10 CANCELLATION

- A. <u>For Cause</u>. The State may cancel any contract resulting from this solicitation for cause at the discretion of the Arkansas Department of Human Services. The State shall give the vendor written notice of cancellation, specifying the terms and the effective date of contract termination.
- B. <u>For Convenience</u>. The State may cancel any contract resulting from the solicitation by giving the Contractor written notice of such cancellation no less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of cancellation.
- C. If upon cancellation the Contractor has provided commodities or services which the State of Arkansas has accepted, and there are no funds legally available to pay for the commodities or services, the Contractor may file a claim with the Arkansas Claims Commission under the laws and regulations governing the filing of such claims.

## 3.11 SEVERABILITY

If any provision of the contract, including items incorporated by reference, is declared or found to be illegal, unenforceable, or void, then both the agency and the vendor **shall** be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision. If the remainder of the contract is capable of performance, it **shall not** be affected by such declaration or finding and **shall** be fully performed.

## **SECTION 4 – STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

- **Do not** provide responses to items in this section.
- 1. **GENERAL**: Any special terms and conditions included in this solicitation **shall** override these Standard Terms and Conditions. The Standard Terms and Conditions and any special terms and conditions **shall** become part of any contract entered into if any or all parts of the bid are accepted by the State of Arkansas.
- 2. ACCEPTANCE AND REJECTION: The State shall have the right to accept or reject all or any part of a bid or any and all bids, to waive minor technicalities, and to award the bid to best serve the interest of the State.
- 3. BID SUBMISSION: Original Bid Packets must be submitted to the Office of State Procurement on or before the date and time specified for bid opening. The Bid Packet must contain all documents, information, and attachments as specifically and expressly required in the *Bid Solicitation*. The bid must be typed or printed in ink. The signature must be in ink. Unsigned bids shall be disqualified. The person signing the bid should show title or authority to bind the firm in a contract. Multiple bids must be placed in separate packages and should be completely and properly identified. Late bids shall not be considered under any circumstances.
- **4. PRICES**: Bid unit price F.O.B. destination. In case of errors in extension, unit prices **shall** govern. Prices **shall** be firm and **shall not** be subject to escalation unless otherwise specified in the *Bid Solicitation*. Unless otherwise specified, the bid **must** be firm for acceptance for thirty (30) days from the bid opening date. "Discount from list" bids are not acceptable unless requested in the *Bid Solicitation*.
- **5. QUANTITIES**: Quantities stated in a *Bid Solicitation* for term contracts are estimates only and are not guaranteed. Contractors **must** bid unit price on the estimated quantity and unit of measure specified. The State may order more or less than the estimated quantity on term contracts. Quantities stated on firm contracts are actual Requirements of the ordering agency.
- **6. BRAND NAME REFERENCES**: Unless otherwise specified in the *Bid Solicitation*, any catalog brand name or manufacturer reference used in the *Bid Solicitation* is descriptive only, not restrictive, and used to indicate the type and quality desired. Bids on brands of like nature and quality will be considered. If bidding on other than referenced specifications, the bid **must** show the manufacturer, brand or trade name, and other descriptions, and should include the manufacturer's illustrations and complete descriptions of the product offered. The State **shall** have the right to determine whether a substitute offered is equivalent to and meets the standards of the item specified, and the State may require the Contractor to supply additional descriptive material. The Contractor **shall** guarantee that the product offered will meet or exceed specifications identified in this *Bid Solicitation*. Contractors not bidding an alternate to the referenced brand name or manufacturer **shall** be required to furnish the product according to brand names, numbers, etc., as specified in the solicitation.
- 7. GUARANTY: All items bid shall be newly manufactured, in first-class condition, latest model and design, including, where applicable, containers suitable for shipment and storage, unless otherwise indicated in the Bid Solicitation. The Contractor hereby guarantees that everything furnished hereunder shall be free from defects in design, workmanship and material, that if sold by drawing, sample or specification, it shall conform thereto and shall serve the function for which it was furnished. The Contractor shall further guarantee that if the items furnished hereunder are to be installed by the Contractor, such items shall function properly when installed. The Contractor shall guarantee that all applicable laws have been complied with relating to construction, packaging, labeling and registration. The Contractor's obligations under this paragraph shall survive for a period of one (1) year from the date of delivery, unless otherwise specified herein.
- **8. SAMPLES**: Samples or demonstrators, when requested, **must** be furnished free of expense to the State. Each sample should be marked with the Contractor's name and address, bid or contract number and item number. If requested, samples that are not destroyed during reasonable examination will be returned at Contractor's expense. After reasonable examination, all demonstrators will be returned at Contractor's expense.
- 9. TESTING PROCEDURES FOR SPECIFICATIONS COMPLIANCE: Tests may be performed on samples or demonstrators submitted with the bid or on samples taken from the regular shipment. In the event products tested fail to meet or exceed all conditions and requirements of the specifications, the cost of the sample used, and the reasonable cost of the testing shall be borne by the Contractor.
- **10. AMENDMENTS**: Contractor's bids cannot be altered or amended after the bid opening except as permitted by regulation.

**11. TAXES AND TRADE DISCOUNTS**: Do not include State or local sales taxes in the bid price. Trade discounts should be deducted from the unit price and the net price should be shown in the bid.

- **12. AWARD**: Term Contract: A contract award will be issued to the successful Contractor. It results in a binding obligation without further action by either party. This award does not authorize shipment. Shipment is authorized by the receipt of a purchase order from the ordering agency. Firm Contract: A written State purchase order authorizing shipment will be furnished to the successful Contractor.
- 13. DELIVERY ON FIRM CONTRACTS: This solicitation shows the number of days to place a commodity in the ordering agency's designated location under normal conditions. If the Contractor cannot meet the stated delivery, alternate delivery schedules may become a factor in an award. The Office of State Procurement shall have the right to extend delivery if reasons appear valid. If the date is not acceptable, the agency may buy elsewhere, and any additional cost shall be borne by the Contractor.
- 14. DELIVERY REQUIREMENTS: No substitutions or cancellations are permitted without written approval of the Office of State Procurement. Delivery shall be made during agency work hours (8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Central Time) unless prior approval for other delivery has been obtained from the agency. Packing memoranda shall be enclosed with each shipment.
- **15. STORAGE**: The ordering agency is responsible for storage if the Contractor delivers within the time required and the agency cannot accept delivery.
- 16. DEFAULT: All commodities furnished shall be subject to inspection and acceptance of the ordering agency after delivery. Back orders, default in promised delivery, or failure to meet specifications shall authorize the Office of State Procurement to cancel this contract or any portion of it and reasonably purchase commodities elsewhere and charge full increase, if any, in cost and handling to the defaulting Contractor. The Contractor must give written notice to the Office of State Procurement and ordering agency of the reason and the expected delivery date. Consistent failure to meet delivery without a valid reason may cause removal from the Contractors list or suspension of eligibility for award.
- **17. VARIATION IN QUANTITY**: The State assumes no liability for commodities produced, processed or shipped in excess of the amount specified on the agency's purchase order.
- **18. INVOICING**: The Contractor **shall** be paid upon the completion of all of the following: (1) submission of an original and the specified number of copies of a properly itemized invoice showing the bid and purchase order numbers, where itemized in the *Bid Solicitation*; (2) delivery and acceptance of the commodities; (3) proper and legal processing of the invoice by all necessary State agencies. Invoices **must** be sent to the "Invoice To" point shown on the purchase order.
- 19. STATE PROPERTY: Any specifications, drawings, technical information, dies, cuts, negatives, positives, data or any other commodity furnished to the Contractor hereunder or in contemplation hereof or developed by the Contractor for use hereunder shall remain property of the State, shall be kept confidential, shall be used only as expressly authorized, and shall be returned at the Contractor's expense to the F.O.B. point provided by the agency or by OSP. Contractor shall properly identify items being returned.
- **20. PATENTS OR COPYRIGHTS**: The Contractor **must** agree to indemnify and hold the State harmless from all claims, damages and costs including attorneys' fees, arising from infringement of patents or copyrights.
- **21. ASSIGNMENT**: Any contract entered into pursuant to this solicitation **shall not** be assignable nor the duties thereunder delegable by either party without the written consent of the other party of the contract.
- 22. CLAIMS: Any claims the Contractor may assert under this Agreement shall be brought before the Arkansas State Claims Commission ("Commission"), which shall have exclusive jurisdiction over all claims that the Contactor may have arising from or in connection with this Agreement. Unless the Contractor's obligations to perform are terminated by the State, the Contractor shall continue to provide the Services under this Agreement even if the Contractor has a claim pending before the Commission.
- 23. CANCELLATION: In the event, the State no longer needs the commodities or services specified for any reason, (e.g., program changes; changes in laws, rules or regulations; relocation of offices; lack of appropriated funding, etc.), the State shall have the right to cancel the contract or purchase order by giving the Contractor written notice of such cancellation thirty (30) days prior to the date of cancellation.
  - Any delivered but unpaid for goods will be returned in normal condition to the Contractor by the State. If the State is unable to return the commodities in normal condition and there are no funds legally available to pay for the goods, the Contractor may file a claim with the Arkansas Claims Commission under the laws and regulations governing the filing of such claims. If upon cancellation the Contractor has provided services which the State has accepted, the

# Contractor may file a claim. **NOTHING IN THIS CONTRACT SHALL BE DEEMED A WAIVER OF THE STATE'S RIGHT TO SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.**

- 24. DISCRIMINATION: In order to comply with the provision of Act 954 of 1977 relating to unfair employment practices, the Contractor agrees that: (a) the Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, sex, color, age, religion, handicap, or national origin; (b) in all solicitations or advertisements for employees, the Contractor shall state that all qualified applicants shall receive consideration without regard to race, color, sex, age, religion, handicap, or national origin; (c) the Contractor will furnish such relevant information and reports as requested by the Human Resources Commission for the purpose of determining compliance with the statute; (d) failure of the Contractor to comply with the statute, the rules and regulations promulgated thereunder and this nondiscrimination clause shall be deemed a breach of contract and it may be cancelled, terminated or suspended in whole or in part; (e) the Contractor shall include the provisions of above items (a) through (d) in every subcontract so that such provisions shall be binding upon such subcontractor or Contractor.
- 25. CONTINGENT FEE: The Contractor guarantees that no one has been retained to solicit or secure this contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies maintained by the Contractor for securing business.
- **26. ANTITRUST ASSIGNMENT**: As part of the consideration for entering into any contract pursuant to this solicitation, the Contractor named on the *Bid Signature Page* for this solicitation, acting herein by the authorized individual or its duly authorized agent, hereby assigns, sells and transfers to the State of Arkansas all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action it may have under the antitrust laws of the United States or this State for price fixing, which causes of action have accrued prior to the date of this assignment and which relate solely to the particular goods or services purchased or produced by this State pursuant to this contract.
- **27. DISCLOSURE**: Failure to make any disclosure required by Governor's Executive Order 98-04, or any violation of any rule, regulation, or policy adopted pursuant to that order, **shall** be a material breach of the terms of this contract. Any Contractor, whether an individual or entity, who fails to make the required disclosure or who violates any rule, regulation, or policy **shall** be subject to all legal remedies available to the agency.
