Isaiah Amen'Ra and his mom, Bertha White, moved from Phoenix, Arizona to Hope, Arkansas in 2006 to care for his ailing grandmother. Being diagnosed with Autism by Dr. Maya Lopez at the James L. Dennis Development Center outreach clinic in Hope, Isaiah began attending an Early Intervention program in Magnolia. After 2 years, he was able to start public school and learned many new things. His mom, a full time employed single mom, advocated for his education.

Disability services in Arkansas were limited compared to Arizona, but with the assistance of Pam Hearnsberger, RN/CHC Care Coordinator and Tina Smith, RN/CHC South Arkansas Area Manager, Isaiah was able to benefit from Medicaid, SSI, TEFRA, PASSE, and the CES Waiver. They have participated in numerous programs including the most recent annual Family Bistro in April.

Graduating high school is a huge accomplishment for Isaiah who is Autistic and non-verbal but with an extremely outgoing personality. As per Ms. White, "graduating was a blessing."

CHC (Children with Chronic Health Conditions) appreciates the opportunity to work with Isaiah and his mom. We wish him the very best. Congratulations Isaiah!
