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DYS FY 2016 Statistics – Summary

Total Commitments FY 2014-2016

2016 = 467 2015 = 526 2014 = 468

Commitments by Offense (figure 1)

Felony = 51% Misdemeanor 37%

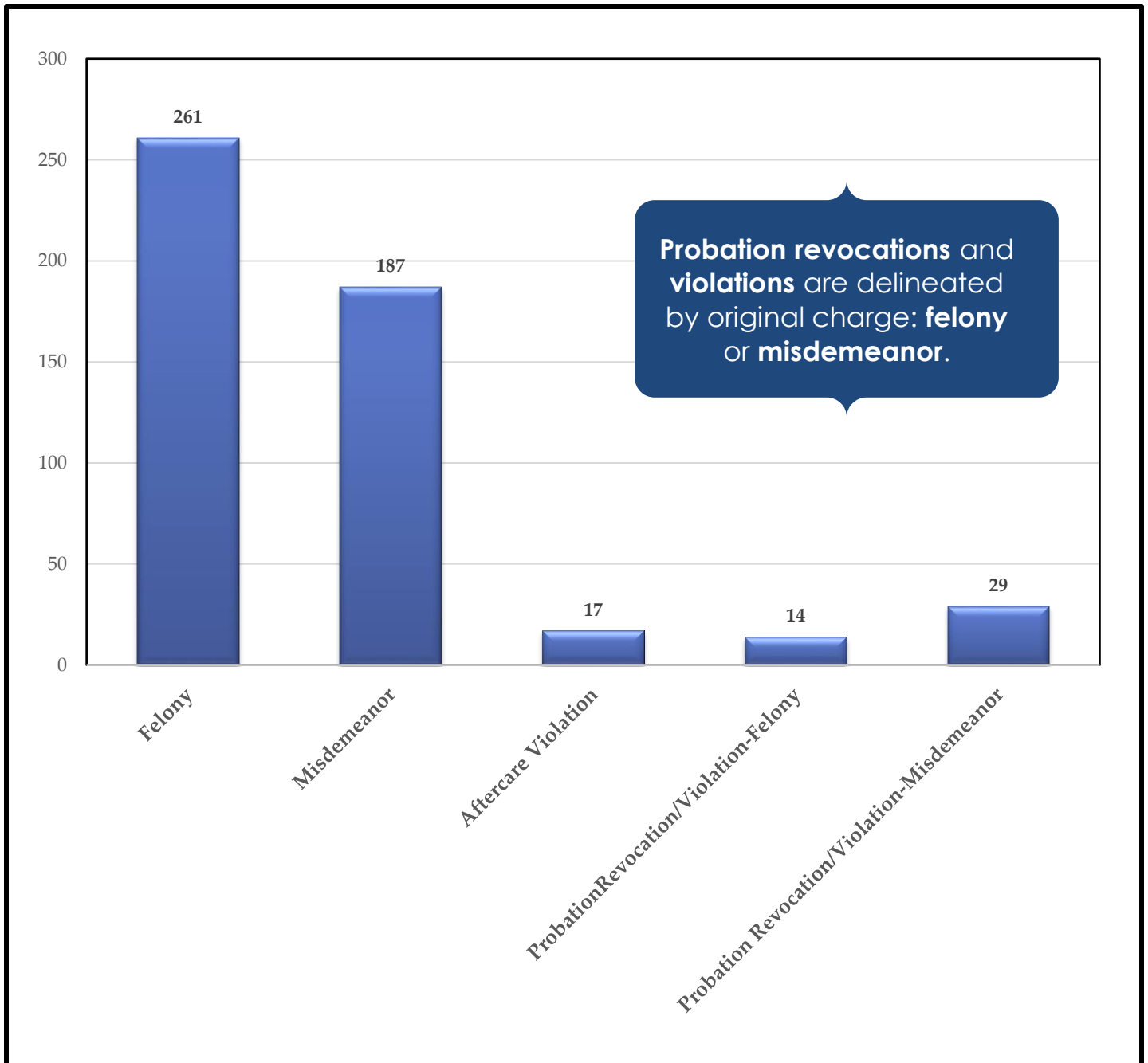


Figure 2: First Commitments vs. Recommits

First Commitments vs. Recommits (figure 2)

First Commits = 66% Recommits = 34%

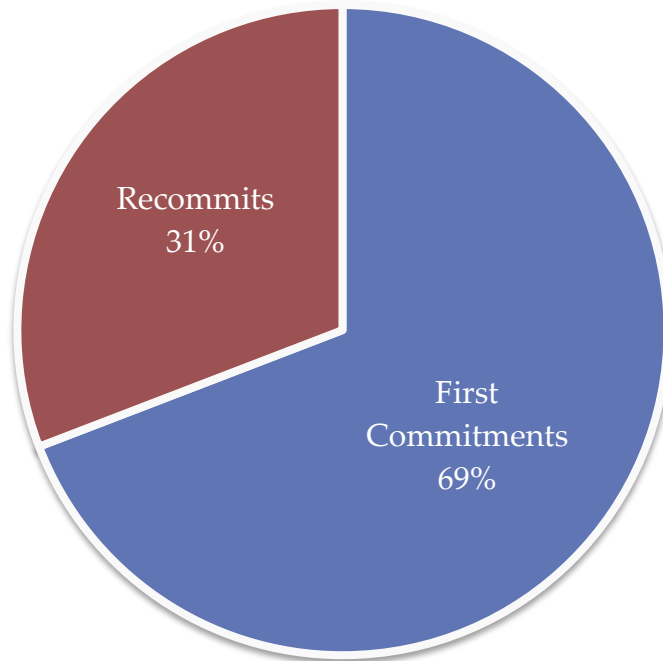


Figure 3: Violent vs. Non-Violent

Violent vs. Non-Violent Offenses (figure 3)

Violent offenses = 9% Non-violent offenses = 91%

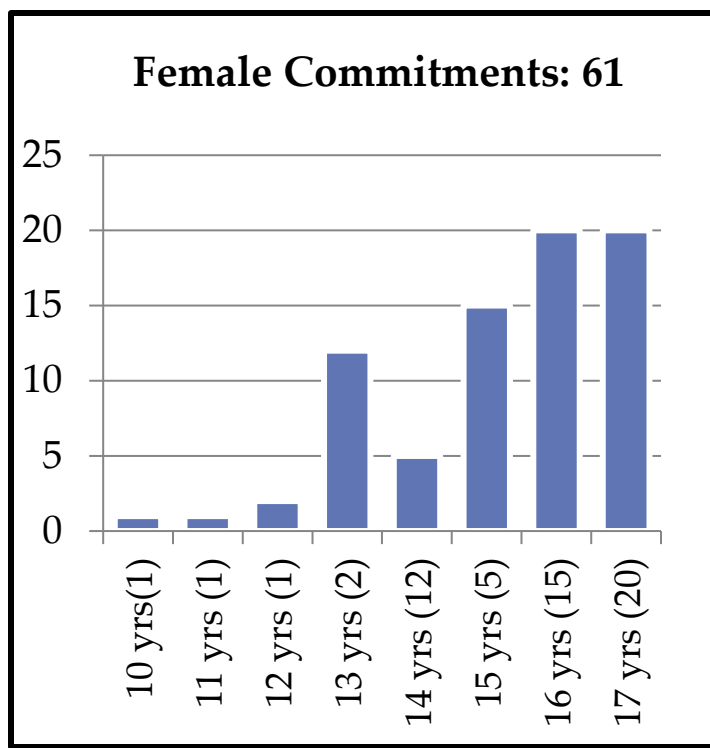
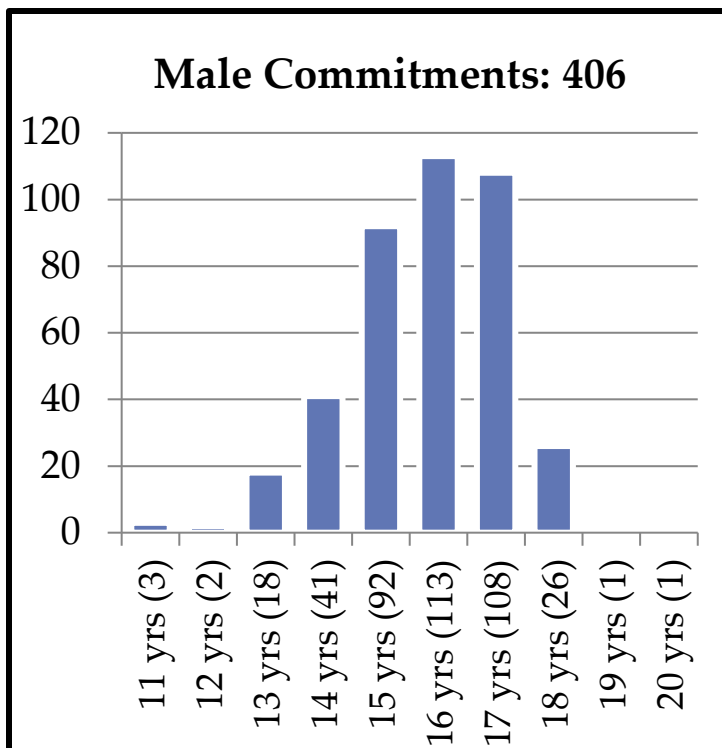
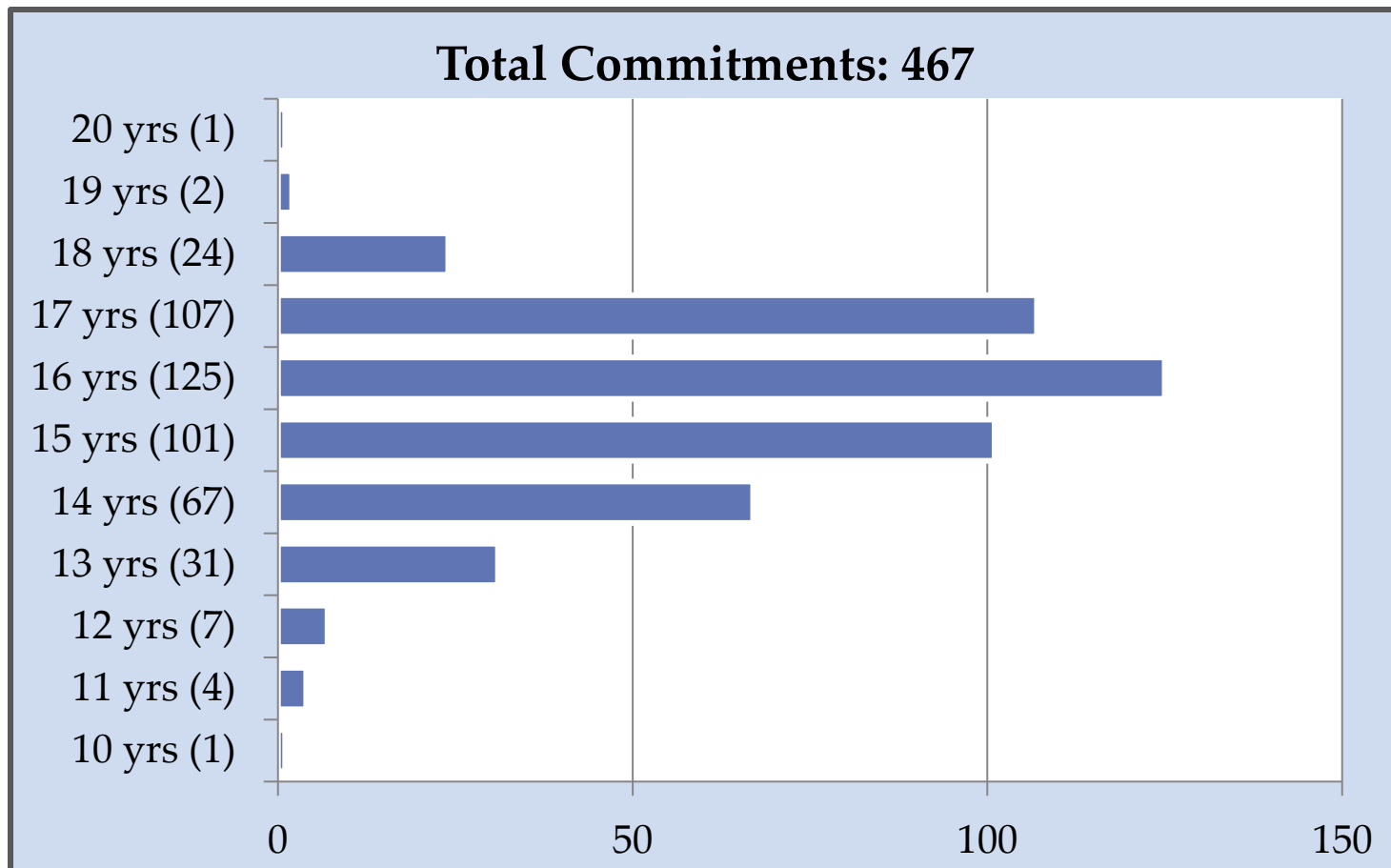


Figure 5: Commitments by Age, Gender, and Race

Commitments by Age, Gender, Race (figure 4, 5, 6)

Total commitments, gender: 87% male, 13% female

AR youth population, gender: 51% male, 49% female

Total commitments, race: 51% African American, 41% white, 8% other

AR youth population, race: 20% African American, 77% white, 3% other

Ages of committed youth: 10-20years

Over half of total commitments were between 16-17 years

Jul 2015 – Jun 2016

Jul 2015 – Jun 2016

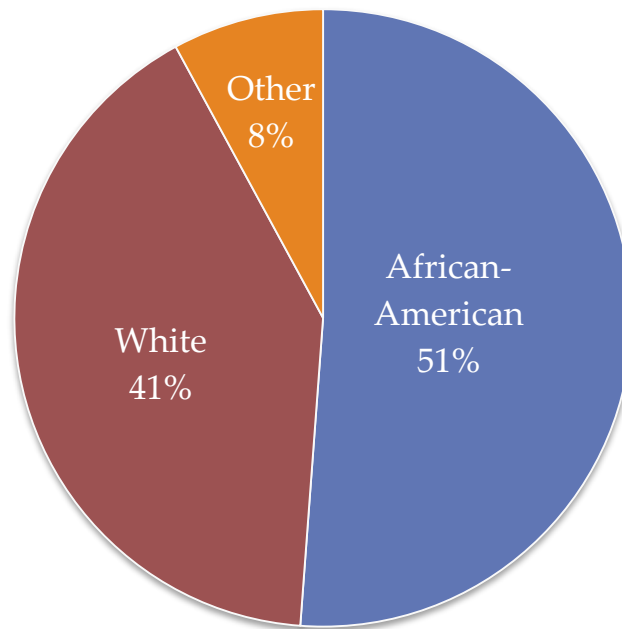


Figure 7: Commitments by Race by County

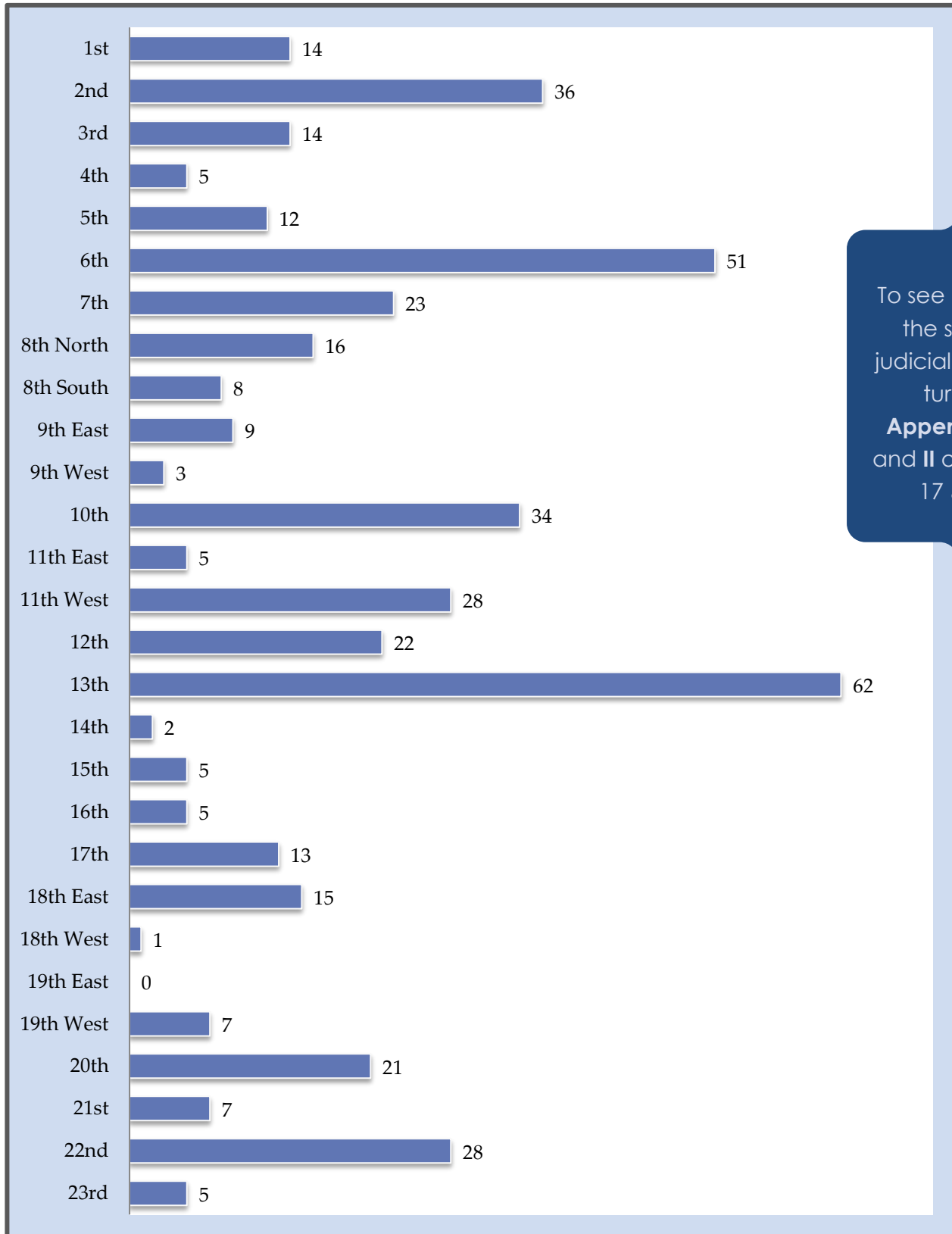

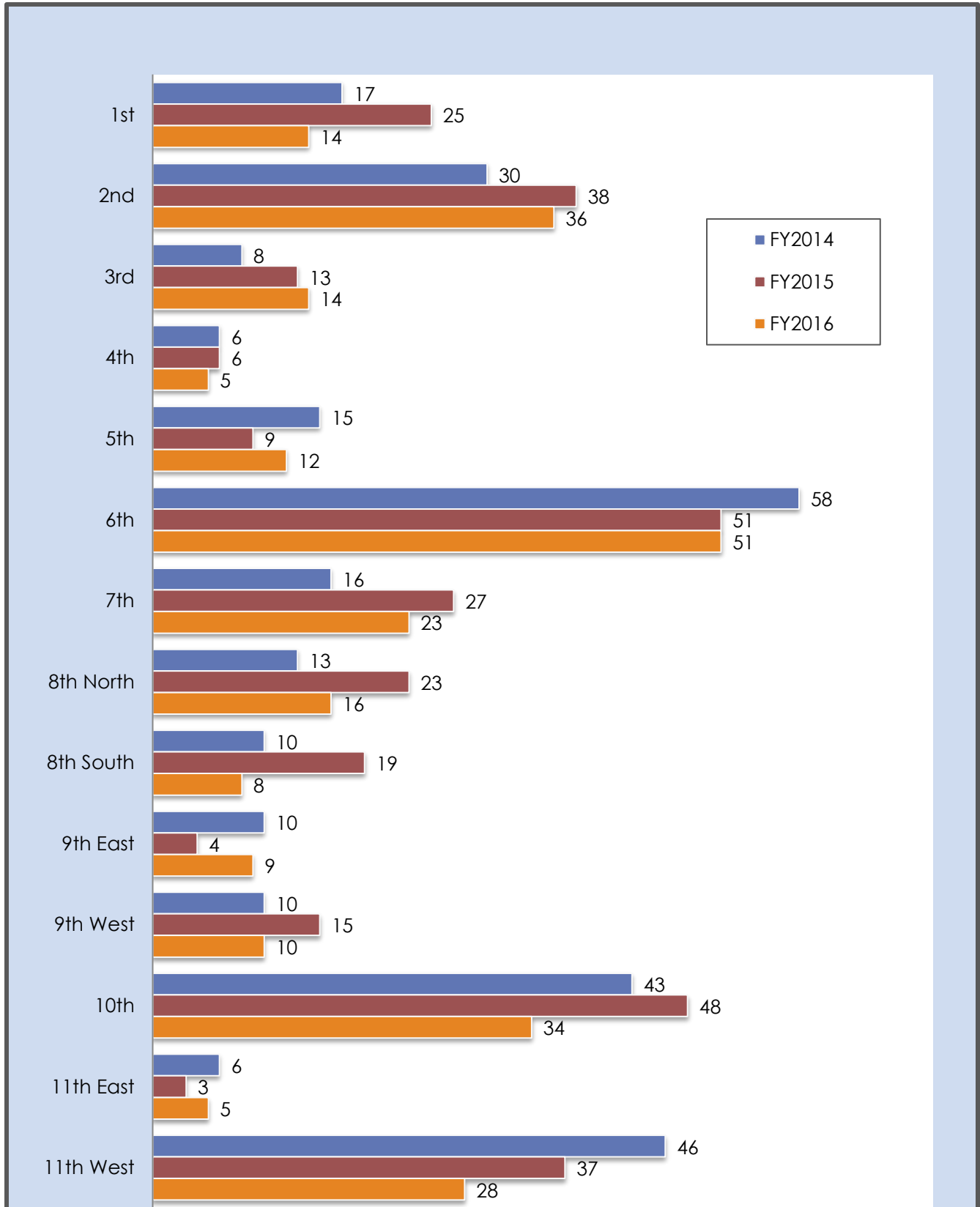
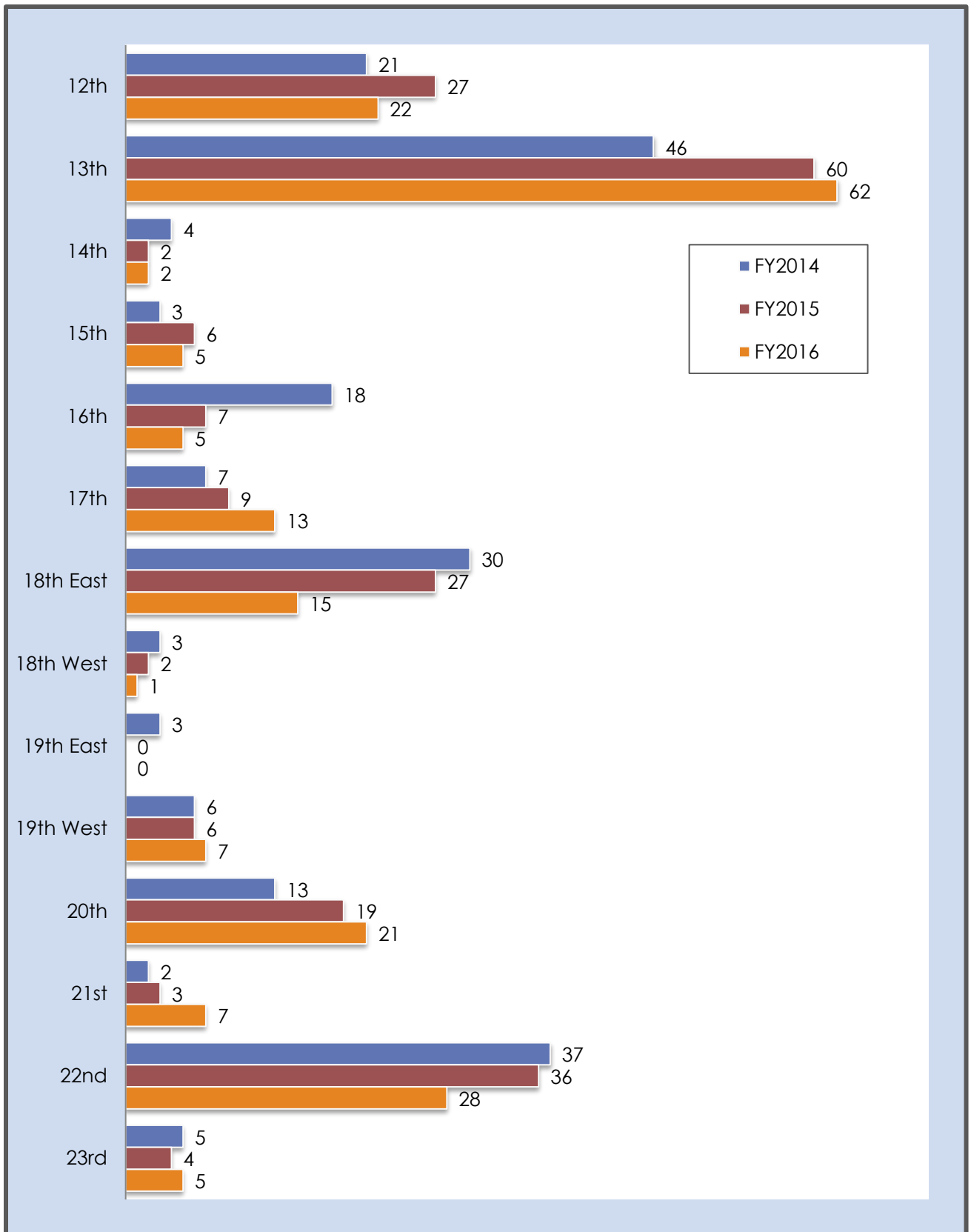
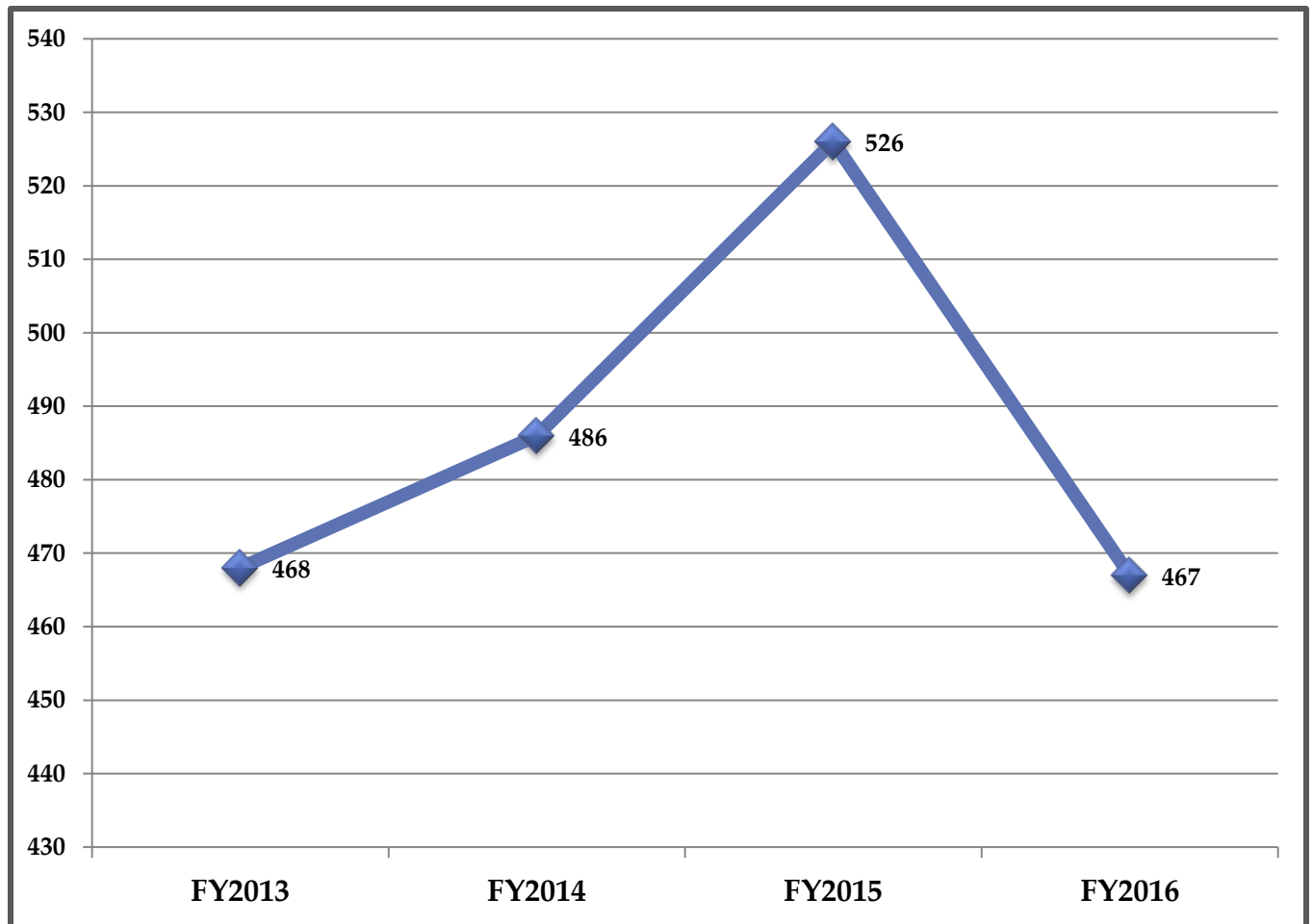


Figure 9: Commitments by District by Year (continued)

Jul 2015 – Jun 2016**



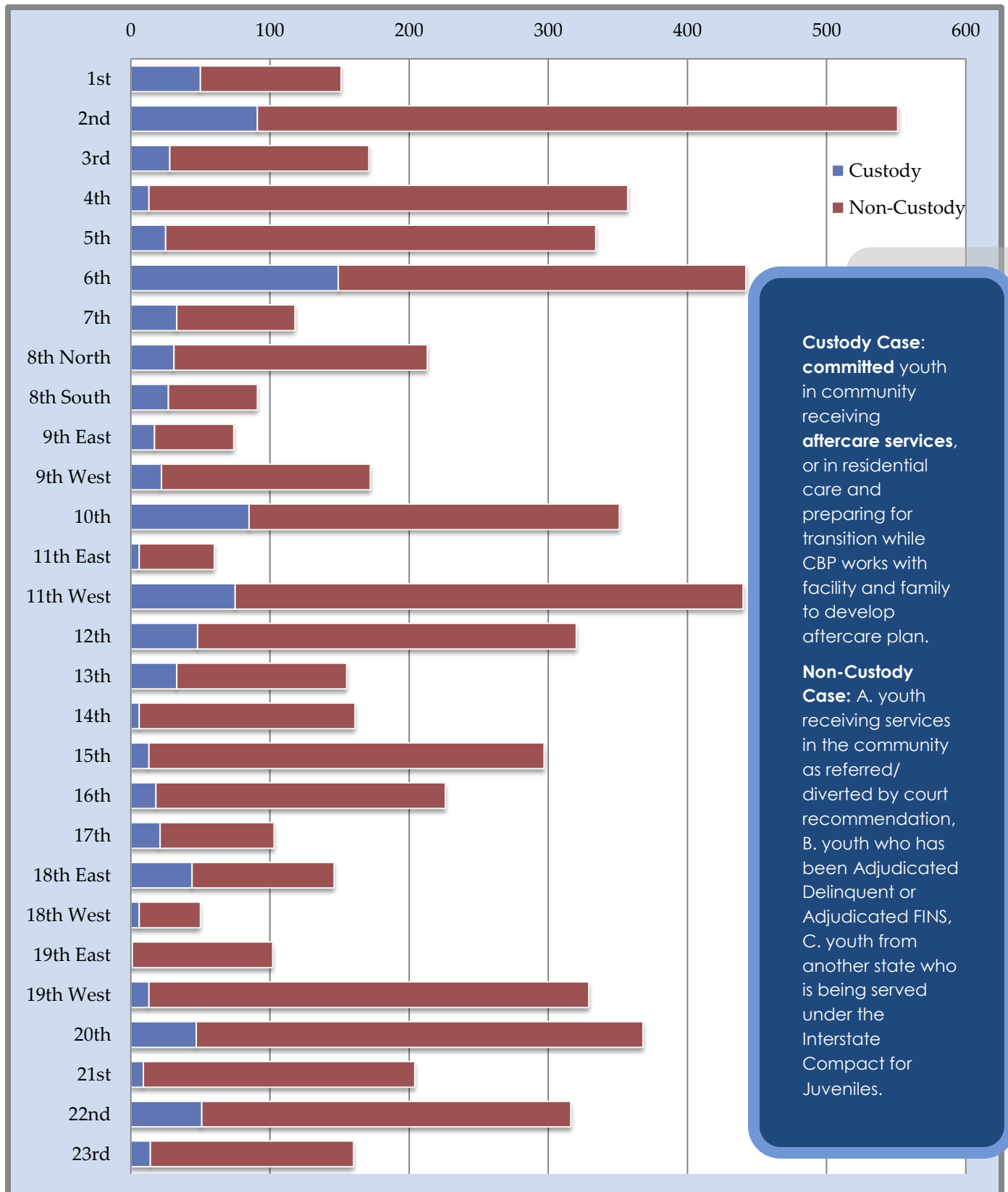

Jul 2015 – Jun 2016**



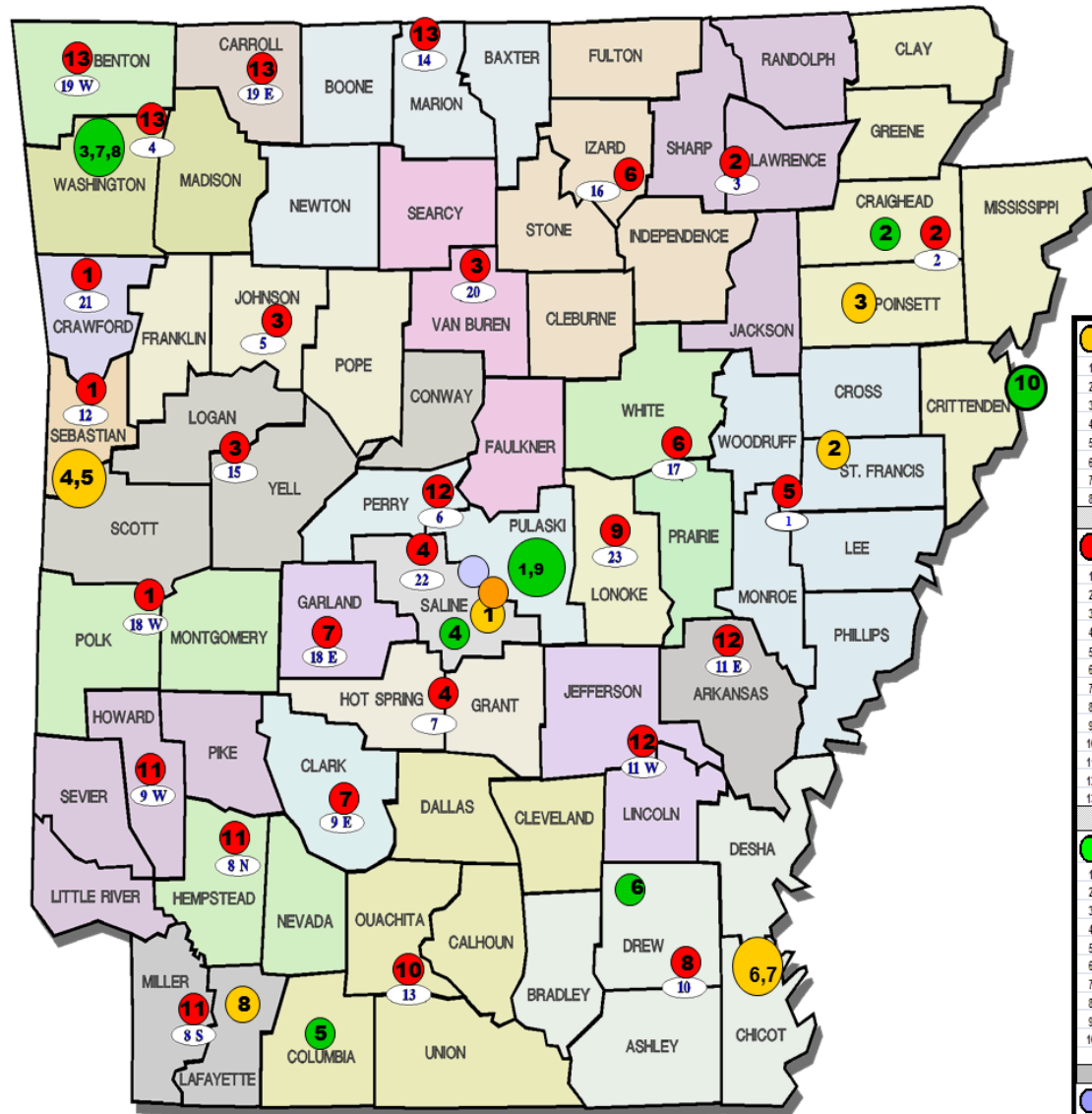
Map of AR DYS Treatment Centers, Specialized Residential Programs, and Community-Based Providers

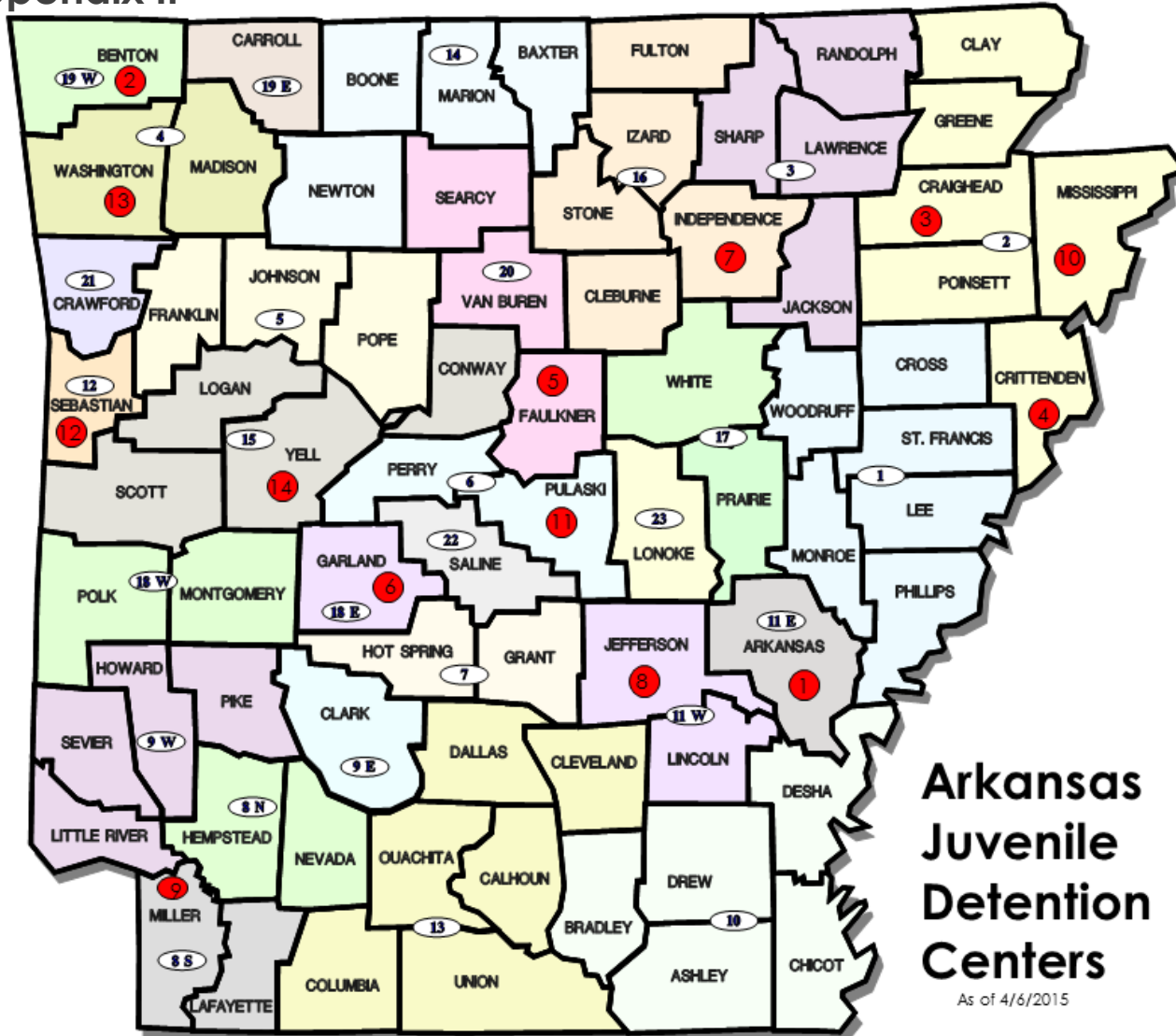
